1. Course objectives

General objective

The aim of the training on auditing of authorised recycling processes for plastic food contact materials in the scope of Commission Regulation (EU) 2022/1616 (repealing Regulation (EU) 282/2008) is to raise awareness on all aspects of the plastic food contact materials and auditing plastic recycling processes. The course also aims to ensure a harmonised and in-depth understanding of the EU requirements for effective implementation of the EU legislation as well as to enhance the uniformity of procedures across the EU Member states.

Specific objectives

- to ensure a clear understanding of the different types of plastics used in food contact materials (FCM), an insight into the process of migration and how migration can be mathematically modelled;
- to help participants to understand the potential sources of contamination in recycled plastics and how the basic principles of risk assessment are applied by EFSA in terms of authorisation of recycling processes;
- to provide deeper understanding of the EU legislation covering recycling, the various processes used for recycling of plastics, the possibilities to reuse plastics as food contact materials again;
- to understand the key points in undertaking an audit of a recycling plant, and be able to identify critical records that need to be provided for inspection;
- to put the theoretical training into a practical context and to provide a 'real-life' experience of typical environments that participants will experience during the field visit during the course.

2. Training dates and locations

One face-to-face training course will be delivered from 20 until 23 February 2024 with approximately <u>15</u> trainees.

An introductory session after the lunch of the first day will be followed by 3 days of training. The course agenda is attached (Annex 3).

5. Face-to-face logistical arrangements

This training sessions will be face-to-face. The European Commission will fund in full the visa, travel, accommodation, catering, and field visit costs for all training participants. No daily allowance will be paid on top of this. Any other costs are to be paid by the participants themselves.

Participants will arrive at the training venue on Tuesday before the events starts or on Monday afternoon/evening, depending on the travel options. The introductory session will be held on Tuesday afternoon followed by the first training activities. Return travel will be on Friday afternoon/evening after the training has finished or Saturday morning, depending on the travel options.

The NSF Euro Consultants event management team will liaise further with the nominated participants for all logistic and practical aspects.

Annex 1: Background and main topics covered in training

Background

It is very important to ensure that all food contact materials are safe in order to provide a high level of protection of consumer's health which is one of the fundamental objectives of the EU. The use of recycled plastic became increasingly common in recent years and therefore, called for new industrial processes which resulted in publishing Commission Regulation (EU) 2022/1616). Member States shall verify that the business operators strictly respect the requirements of the EU legislative framework and conditions of authorisation.

The integration of training activities on audit of plastic recycling process in the BTSF initiative is a means to promote the upgrading of inspectors' skills as well as improving the effectiveness and harmonization of official controls.

The following topics will be covered during the training session:

- Topic 1: EU legislation, risk assessment and authorisation process
- Topic 2: Plastic recycling process and quality system
- Topic 3: Audit of recycling premises

Training material

Face-to-face format

Participants will receive in advance the training material to be used during the F2F training sessions. The following materials of relevance to the course will be uploaded and made accessible on the BTSF Academy:

HaDEA Online Evaluation

Feedback on each training session will be collected through the HADEA on-line evaluation survey, completed by all participants at the end of the training. The Event Management Team will provide instructions to the participants how to access and fill out the survey through the BTSF Academy. Trainees will be asked to evaluate the course in several aspects: performance of tutors, technical coverage and training materials, networking and interaction opportunities provided during the training, relevance of the topics to their everyday work, reaching the training objectives.
