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1. Situation of the project during COVID-19 crisis

Due to the current COVID-19 coronavirus epidemic, the European Health and Digital Executive Agency (HaDEA) cancelled the organisation of all face-to-face activities of the Better Training for Safer Food initiative (in EU and non-EU countries) from March 2020 and until the situation improves.

The present project is currently in its second phase of implementation, whose implementation was scheduled to take place between December 2019 and December 2021, and foresee the organiasation of 3 courses on agrifood investigation techniques and e-commerce of agrifood, summing a total of 12 sessions.

In May 2021 were approved the conversion to virtual classes and the extension of the contract until December 2022. And on the 18th of June, HaDEA communicated to all contractors that face-to-face sessions can be restored from 1st September 2021, due to the evolution of the COVID-19 pandemic throughout the world, the variability in epidemiological and vaccinal status across different geographical zones, and the developments in the Commission's Digital Covid Certificate.

This communication is therefore a detailed description of the new developments regarding the training activities that will take place next 6 months, both virtually and face-to-face, considering the evolution of the pandemic situation in the EU.

2. Changes to be considered

The Virtual Classes will substitute face-to-face training sessions until we can revert to having on-site sessions, initially estimated for November and December this year. This has taken us to make the following adaptations to the initial arrangements that may be of major interest to you:

- Distribution and allocation of places per invited country (number of sessions and participants per session).
- Process of registration and deadline for submitting registration forms, different for VC and for F2F sessions.
- Methodology switched from a face-to-face environment to a virtual interactive space, using different IT tools and means of communication - IT requirements for attending the VC training session: BTSF Academy platform and Zoom.
- Programme and distribution of the contents (number days, distribution of contents per day and timing).

In the next sections, you will find explained, as did in previous information to NCPs, the general and specific objectives of the training, the schedule of sessions, the list of invited countries, the selection





criteria, the responsibilities of the different actors involved in the programme, the training programme, the training dates and deadlines, and the presentation of the learning platform and IT requirements participants will need to attend.

The programme included in Annex 3 is for virtual classes only. For face-to-face sessions, the programme will go back to the initial one, from Monday afternoon to Thursday midday (2 full days and 2 half days).

3. Course objectives

General objective

To improve the effectiveness of official controls in relation to agri-food fraud and e-commerce of food, it is essential that staff of competent authorities be equipped with appropriate knowledge and skills, adjusted to the needs of such controls. The training is serving therefore as a way to disseminate best practices, improve knowledge in this area and enabling the exchange of practical experience.

Two years ago, it was launched a new training programme covering New Food Investigation Techniques issue. The second phase of this contract is just starting.

The objective of the present program is to improve knowledge and skills of control staff on specific investigation techniques used to identify agri-food fraud (FF) or to perform official control duties on e-commerce of food and food related products, disseminating best practices and enabling the exchange of practical experience.

The program will be divided in two courses, having developed two different levels for the second course, standard and advance with the aim to improve knowledge on new effective and efficient control/investigation techniques to:

- Identify more easily fraud along the agri-food chain
- Ensure better official controls on e-commerce in the food sector.

Specific objectives

The specific objectives of the **Course on general investigation and control techniques (NIT)** are to give tools and techniques to design, implement and manage agri-food fraud units; promote risk based investigations; spread the knowledge on methods and investigation techniques for the prevention of agri-food fraud; and ensure that the trainees have a solid understanding of ways to collaborate, coordinate with other enforcement bodies in their countries, other Member States and with other supranational organizations.

The specific objectives of the **Course on e-commerce of food, standard level (EC1)**, are to provide tools and techniques to identify internet food business operating and detect those not following the legal requirements; facilitate practical training on internet trading investigation; and spread knowledge on methods to investigate





in different internet platforms, and learn practical and legal requirements to undertake official controls on internet food business; and ensure that the participants have a solid understanding of channels of communication, cooperation with different administrations and market stakeholders.

The specific objectives of the **Course on e-commerce of food, advanced level (EC2)**, are the same as course EC1; however, the level to reach will be higher as long as the practical exercises requested.

In this sense, participants will be invited to participate actively in discussions, debriefings and working groups. They will be given preparation tasks prior to the attendance to the session, updating their knowledge of EU legislation in their sector and bringing examples of their national practices and communication materials in their given sector.





4. Selection criteria for participants

The training program is opened to participants whose application form is submitted by the corresponding BTSF NCPs, following the selection process described in the following paragraph.

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The targeted audience should comply with the following criteria for NIT (COURSE 1):

- Officials from inspection bodies: ideally involved in planning and organizing control activities (preferably at central level)
- Police investigators/ Customs officers/Judicial staff...etc.

IMPORTANT NOTE – COURSE on NIT: In order to assure a multidisciplinary approach in the training, NCPs will be required to send 2 participants to the session, one from the Competent Authority responsible of inspections, and another from any other agency involved in the investigation of agri-food fraud (police, customs, judicial services, etc).

The targeted audience should comply with the following criteria for EC1:

• Officials from inspection bodies: ideally involved in planning and organizing control activities (preferably at central level).

The targeted audience for EC2 is:

- Enforcement staff having
 - at least 3 years' experience working in competent authorities related to
 Internet investigations of agri-food frauds;
 - or proven knowledge of Internet investigation of agri-food frauds by enclosing the certificate for having attended Course 2a (EC1) in under this contract or previous contract (BTSF 2013 96 14);

<u>and</u>

• Submit a small presentation of a real case the participant has been involved in (2-3 slides), in an attached ppt document to the registration form.

*PMC can facilitate individually to each NCP the list of participants that have attended Course 2 (EC1) on previous editions.

Participants to all courses should:

- Have the capacity to work and make interventions in English language.
- Be compromised to disseminate the knowledge gained (courses, workshops, articles, blogs) in the short medium term once the training ends.





The selection of appropriate participants has a direct impact on the training session. Similar level of knowledge among them, with the possibility to have pro-active and positive discussions, is one of the key elements for success.

AENOR applies a qualitative approach for the selection of participants. National Contact Points are kindly invited to contact the Project Management Unit if they require any modification of the list or if they would wish to submit additional registration of additional participants, as due to multiple circumstances, sometimes places are left vacant, and it is easier and quicker to consider participants from the reserve list.

In any case, you will be able to check the main data of the project, related to dates and locations, at the website www.btsf-aenor.com. The website will be regularly updated with details of forthcoming courses.

5. Training dates

Three Virtual Classroom (VC) and **two F2F** training sessions of two different courses are foreseen to be organised between September and December 2021.

(*) **NOTE:** Sessions Face-to-face will be organised considering COVID-19 outbreak is controlled, and vaccination in EU countries reaches the expected % of coverage in EU population. COVID-19 measures will be observed both in travel and hotel arrangements. **Only participants with vaccination certificate will be able to attend.** Should the minimum number of participants not be reached, the session could be switched to a Virtual class session in the same dates programmed.

6. Country allocations

- Additional candidates for the waiting list will be welcomed. We will do our best to allocate them.

Annex 1: Background and main topics covered in training

Background

The Better Training for Safer Food on New Investigation Techniques was launched in 2013, as cases of agri-food fraud were increasing, reaching a great dissemination by the Media at the time of the famous horse meat scandal. An increasing trend to commit fraud in the sales of food was intimately linked to the big economic crisis, in which some sectors in the market found opportunities to practice counterfeiting, and use prohibited or low-quality ingredients in food, with possible no hygiene controls, in order to make substantial profits. This represents not only a serious threat to the confidence of the consumers, but possibly put their health in risk. Agri-food fraud cases can affect the whole agri-food chain, sometimes using very sophisticated techniques, to avoid being detected. Internet offers multiple choices and options; complete command of these tools should be known and used by those fighting against agri-food fraud products sold in internet.

The key for success was cooperating in a most efficient way. In this sense, all stakeholders should have a role in the fight against agri-food fraud crime, including industry, consumer operators, market surveillance and sanitary authorities, police and judicial bodies.

The current challenge not only require new IT tools, but a better use of the information, methods and integrate this information in a more coordinated way, using the skills and expertise of agri-food fraud units to attend these needs, and working in collaboration among administrations.

To improve the effectiveness of official controls in relation to agri-food fraud and e-commerce of food, it is essential that staff of competent authorities be equipped with appropriate knowledge and skills, adjusted to the needs of such controls. The training is serving therefore as a way to disseminate best practices, improve knowledge in this area and enabling the exchange of practical experience.

Annex 2: Legislation and guidance

Agri-food fraud is a singular topic to be addressed within the "BTSF frame." The relevance of this fraudulent behaviour among most of the Control and enforcement EU Authorities is somehow recent, and there is not yet a detailed common legislation to be applied.

In EU there is no legislative framework to target agri-food fraud. The issue is directly dealt with at national level by Member States. The training course has been defined in order to identify effective actions and strengthen European rules and controls at the EU level.

Fraud cases have been detected in different countries across EU and third countries. Showing that collaboration among agencies is needed to avoid the cross border fraudulent behaviour. During the training time will be devoted to identifying authorities/ enforcement agencies that should be involved at the different stages of the agri-food chain, and take decisions, sharing intelligence and finding ways of collaboration, coordinating actions to be put in place. It will be shown how it is possible to establish links between food crime and criminal organizations.

Traditional investigation and control techniques are not always sufficient to properly control e-commerce of food and food related products, nor to reveal cases of fraud in the agri-food chain (be it through internet-based or traditional businesses) as many competent authorities do not have the necessary equipment and appropriate approach.

The official control of E-commerce of food is scarce in many of the EU countries, and in most cases, it is a responsibility of the Food Control authority.

Internet traders which are food business operators according to EU Legislation are often not registered (Regulation EC 852/2004) and are therefore not known to food control authorities. Course on ecommerce of food, standard level, provide tools and techniques to identify internet food business operating and detect those not following the legal requirements; facilitate practical training on internet trading investigation; and spread knowledge on methods to investigate in different internet platforms, and learn practical and legal requirements to undertake official controls on internet food business; and ensure that the participants have a solid understanding of channels of communication, cooperation with different administrations and market stakeholders.

Great relevance will be given to methods for an efficient exchange of information between units on





cross-border, presenting cases and multi-lingual offers (web shops and platforms), including the use of the Administrative Assistance and Cooperation system (AAC system).

Sessions will be devoted to payment systems, how to set up contacts with selling and payment platforms (visa, PayPal, eBay, Amazon, etc.). All the above will be practically presented showing latest international initiatives on policy development regarding on-line investigations.

Other considerations in the fight against illicit on-line sells will be presented such the need to make the research without revealing the identity, of products covering offers originating inside and outside the EU. They must be able to document online offers and purchase processes according to the requirements of Member States' legal authorities.

Annex 4: Technical requirements

The VC sessions will be organised with the use of the Zoom conferencing tool. The participants will take part in a short Zoom test training session in the weeks before the actual session. The Zoom test training will help participants to become familiar with the Zoom tool. They will also receive some general information on the course and have the opportunity to ask questions.

The participants should have <u>a computer with a working camera and audio system (speaker and microphone)</u> as well as a good internet connection.

To avoid delays, the registered participants will be contacted for a technical test of their equipment a few days before the training sessions. This will allow participants to test their equipment and view the main features of the VC application platform. During this brief test, participants will have the chance to learn all the tools of the VC platform.

During this meeting, the Event Manager and Assistant Event Manager will also go through the main aspects of the agenda and different sessions that are foreseen. Additionally, in the morning of Day 1 of the VC, time will be dedicated to a technical session to refresh participants on the main features of the platform, and ensure connections are working properly.





Annex 5: Training material, outcomes and dissemination activities

BTSF initiative is a very successful tool to disseminate knowledge and best practices. Nevertheless, according to the general evaluation on effectiveness and efficiency of BTSF, it has been recommended to expand further BTSF. One of the ways to reaching this objective is by fostering Member State impact dissemination activities through fine-tuning of participants selection process and developing a more precise performance indicators to measure the outcome and impact.

With the aim to better respond to this requirement, the present program foresees two indicators:

Training material

All participants will receive the training material well in advance of the training. The material will include additional pre-recorded material for offline studies. Preparatory videos will introduce the specific topic and provide background information to participants.

<u>Dissemination questionnaire</u>

Two to three months after the respective training session, participants will receive a standard questionnaire requesting information on the dissemination activities of the participant after the training, and details on differences in the approach adopted in day-to-day work following the training.

<u>Self-assessment test</u>

Furthermore, the programme will include an anonymous knowledge test to be carried out at the beginning and at the end of each training session in order to measure the impact of the training on the understanding of the participants of the subjects taught.

Participants are expected to agree to carry out the above tests and to reply to the surveys and questionnaires. Participants agree to be registered in the BTSF Academy and agree to be recorded during Virtual Classroom Training sessions and to take a group photo of the participants and tutors at the end of the training. Videos and photo will be published in the BTSF Academy in the corresponding Training course section and will be visible only to the registered participants in that Training course.

Annex 7: Data protection notice

The following Data Protection Notice explains the reason for the processing of all personal data provided by the participants and how HADEA will collect and handle them ensuring their protection. It also details how that information is used and what rights the data owner may exercise in relation to the data.

1. The personal data of the participants is processed in accordance with Regulation (EU) No 2018/1725 on the protection of individuals with regards to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data. As the organisation of BTSF training courses implies the collection of individuals' personal data, its processing falls within the provisions of the above-mentioned Regulation.

The data controller of the processing operation is Head of the Health & Food Safety Unit of the Health and Digital Executive Agency (HADEA), acting as delegated HADEA'S data controller.

Personal data is accessed by the HADEA staff involved in the management of the BTSF training courses.

The data provided will also be accessed by National Contact Points (NCPs) and by DG SANTE.

The data processor is AENOR, the external contractor involved in the organisation of BTSF training courses who process the participants' personal data on HADEA'S behalf.

The **legal basis** for the processing activities is Article 5(a) of Regulation EU 2018/1725 because processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest (or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body)* and Article 5(d) of Regulation EU 2018/1725 for the non-mandatory data.

2. The **purpose(s)** of this processing is the selection, enrolment, and participation in the training activities under the BTSF, as well as for statistical purposes.

In addition, data is processed for the following purposes:

- to plan and organise training activities for BTSF participants.
- to issue certificates of participation for the different training courses.
- to collect feedback from participants so that the controller can deliver better and more
 effective training, according to participants' needs and knowledge as well as the skills
 necessary for their job.
- to perform ex-post evaluation of the impact of the BTSF Initiative.

HADEA covers all needs on the treatment of information for the BTSF Initiative.

3. The following of the participants' data are collected:





- Name and surname.
- Date of birth.
- Gender.
- · Nationality.
- ID or passport details.
- Contact details (e-mail address, telephone number, mobile telephone number, postal address, name address and phone number of the sending organisation).
- Expertise, technical skills and languages, educational background, professional experience including details on current and past employment.

These are **mandatory** data for the purpose(s) outlined above.

In addition, dietary and medical requirements (such as specific dietary requirements, severe food allergies, medical conditions requiring special attention in case of an accident) are collected. These data can only be processed based on your explicit prior consent on the basis of Article 5.1(d) of Regulation EU 2018/1725.

Non-mandatory personal data may be collected such as photos and videos. These data can also only be processed based on their explicit prior consent on the basis of Article 5(d) of Regulation EU 2018/1725.

- 4. The **recipients** of the participant's personal data will be HADEA and its contractors in charge of the organisation of the training and bodies charged with monitoring or inspection tasks in application of EU law (e.g. internal audits, Court of Auditors, European Anti-fraud Office (OLAF)). The personal data will not be transferred to non-EU countries or international organisations.
- 5. The participant's **personal data** will be kept only for the time needed to achieve the purposes for which it is processed.

However, we may keep information identifying them for a longer period for historical, statistical or scientific purposes with the appropriate safeguards in place.

Reports containing personal data will be archived according to HADEA'S legal framework.

6. The participants have the right to access their personal data and to request their personal data to be rectified, if the data is inaccurate or incomplete; where applicable, they have the right to request restriction or to object to processing, to request a copy or erasure of their personal data held by the data controller. If processing is based on their consent, they have the right to withdraw their consent at any time, without affecting the lawfulness of the processing based on their consent before its withdrawal.

Their request to exercise one of the above rights will be dealt with without undue delay and in any case within one month.
